The Malaysian Construction Industry Excellence Awards (MCIEA) is CIDB Malaysia's premier recognition platform that celebrates outstanding achievements across the construction industry. The awards honour the projects, organisations, and individuals that demonstrate excellence in innovation, leadership, quality, safety, and sustainability.

Through MCIEA, CIDB honours the builders, professionals, and industry leaders whose contributions are shaping the future of Malaysia's built environment.

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BEST CONTRACTOR AWARDS (G1-G6)

The Best Contractor Awards recognise and celebrate Malaysian contractors who have demonstrated excellence in managing their companies and delivering quality construction projects. These awards honour contractors who exemplify strong leadership, technical capability, and a commitment to best practices in the construction industry.

Through this category, CIDB aims to acknowledge contractors who not only complete projects successfully but also uphold high standards of professionalism, innovation, safety, and quality in their work.

To ensure fair recognition across the industry, the awards are presented according to CIDB contractor registration grades:

- **Best Contractor – Grade G1**
- **Best Contractor – Grade G2**
- **Best Contractor – Grade G3**
- **Best Contractor – Grade G4**
- **Best Contractor – Grade G5**
- **Best Contractor – Grade G6**



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following:

- 1. Company Performance**
Leadership, management practices, and organisational capability.
- 2. Technical Capability**
Experience, expertise, and ability to deliver quality projects.
- 3. Adoption of Best Practices**
Commitment to safety, quality, innovation, and sustainability.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to **Malaysian contractors from Grade G1 to G6 with valid CIDB registration.**
2. Contractors participating in this category shall have ONE (1) or more completed projects and have obtained a Certificate of Practical Completion (CPC), Certificate of Completion and Compliance (CCC), or any equivalent certifications between **01 January 2021 to 31 December 2025.**
3. Recipients of the **Best Contractor Awards** MCIEA from the previous year are eligible to participate in the MCIEA in the following year in the same category, provided they do not submit the same project that earned them the award (they must submit a different project).
4. Contractors may submit **up to TWO (2) projects completed** within the eligibility period.

BUILDER OF THE YEAR AWARD (G7)

The Builder of the Year Award recognises outstanding Malaysian Grade G7 contractors who have demonstrated exceptional leadership, technical excellence, and professionalism in delivering major construction projects.

This award honours contractors who set the benchmark for the industry through strong organisational capability, innovative project delivery, and a commitment to the highest standards of safety, quality, and sustainability.

Through this category, CIDB aims to recognise contractors whose achievements contribute significantly to the advancement of Malaysia's construction industry and who exemplify excellence in managing complex projects and delivering value to clients and communities.



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following:

1. **Corporate Leadership and Company Performance**
Vision, leadership, organisational capability, and overall company performance.
2. **Technical Excellence and Project Delivery**
Demonstrated ability to successfully deliver complex projects with high standards of quality and efficiency.
3. **Innovation and Industry Advancement**
Adoption of innovative construction methods, digital technologies, and sustainable practices.
4. **Contribution to the Industry and Community**
Efforts in developing talent, promoting best practices, and contributing to the advancement of the construction industry.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to **Malaysian G7 contractors with valid CIDB registration.**
2. Contractors participating in this category shall have ONE (1) or more completed projects and have obtained a Certificate of Practical Completion (CPC), Certificate of Completion and Compliance (CCC), or any equivalent certifications between **01 January 2021 to 31 December 2025.**
3. Recipients of the **Builder Of The Year Award** MCIEA from the previous year are eligible to participate in the MCIEA in the following year in the same category, provided they do not submit the same project that earned them the award (they must submit a different project).
4. Contractors may submit **up to THREE (3) projects completed** within the eligibility period.

EXCELLENCE IN FACILITIES MANAGEMENT (FM) AWARD

The Excellence in Facilities Management (FM) Award recognises organisations that demonstrate outstanding performance in managing, maintaining, and optimising built assets to ensure long-term functionality, safety, and sustainability.

This award honours facilities management contractors that consistently deliver high standards of service through effective asset management practices, innovative maintenance strategies, and strong operational leadership. It recognises companies that enhance the value, functionality, and sustainability of buildings and infrastructure throughout their lifecycle.

Through this category, CIDB Malaysia aims to highlight the critical role of facilities management in supporting the performance and resilience of Malaysia's built environment, while promoting professionalism, innovation, and best practices within the facilities management sector.



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following key areas:

- 1. Service Excellence and Operational Performance**
Demonstrated effectiveness in delivering facilities management services, including maintenance management, operational efficiency, and overall service quality.
- 2. Asset Management and Maintenance Strategy**
Implementation of structured maintenance programmes and systematic asset management practices that support long-term asset performance and reliability.
- 3. Innovation and Technology Adoption**
Adoption of digital tools, smart technologies, or innovative approaches that enhance operational efficiency and improve facilities management outcomes.
- 4. Sustainability and Environmental Practices**
Implementation of energy efficiency measures, sustainable operational practices, and environmentally responsible initiatives within facilities management operations.
- 5. Client Satisfaction and Value Creation**
Ability to deliver value to clients through improved building performance, cost efficiency, and service reliability.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to **Malaysian facilities management contractors registered with CIDB under Specialisation Codes F01 and/or F02.**
2. Participating organisations must demonstrate:
 - At least **THREE (3) active facilities management service engagements**, and
 - At least **ONE (1) operational facility or facilities portfolio that has been managed for a minimum period of ONE (1) year.**
3. The facilities management contract or project submitted must have been **operational within the period of 01 January 2021 to 31 December 2025.**
4. Each company may submit **a maximum of THREE (3) facilities management contracts or projects.**

INTERNATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The International Achievement Award recognises Malaysian contractors who have successfully delivered construction projects outside Malaysia and demonstrated excellence in project execution, technical capability, and global competitiveness.

This award celebrates Malaysian construction companies that have expanded their expertise beyond national borders and contributed to enhancing the reputation of the Malaysian construction industry at the international level.

Through this category, CIDB aims to acknowledge contractors who demonstrate strong leadership, innovation, and professionalism in delivering projects in international markets.



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following areas:

1. **International Project Delivery**
Successful delivery of construction projects outside Malaysia, including project complexity, scale, and execution.
2. **Technical Excellence and Quality**
Demonstrated technical capability and construction quality in international projects.
3. **Innovation and Best Practices**
Adoption of innovative construction methods, technologies, sustainability management practices
4. **Global Competitiveness and Industry Impact**
Contribution to enhancing the reputation and competitiveness of Malaysian contractors in international markets. The ability to project excellent image for Malaysia in terms of project management, timeliness in completing project, host country perception, corporate social responsibilities (CSR).
5. **Overcoming Challenges**
Ability of company to overcome international construction challenges such as market difficulty, degree of complexity, cultural barriers, different style of management, innovative, technology transfer, securing financial funding and any operational practice that are related to the industry.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to **contractors or their parent company with valid CIDB registration**
2. Contractor participating in this category shall have ONE (1) or more completed international projects with **project value of RM30 million and above.**
3. The projects must have obtained **Certificate of Practical Completion (CPC), Certificate of Completion and Compliance (CCC), or equivalent certification** between **01 January 2021 and 31 December 2025.**
4. Percentage of equity for Malaysian contractor **at least 30%** for joint venture company.
5. Recipients of the **International Achievement Award** MCIEA from the previous year are eligible to participate in the MCIEA in the following year in the same category, provided they do not submit the same project that earned them the award (they must submit a different project).
6. Contractors may submit **at least ONE (1) project completed** within the eligibility period.

BEST PROJECT AWARDS (BUILDING/INFRASTRUCTURE)

The Best Project Award recognises outstanding construction projects that demonstrate excellence in planning, execution, innovation, and overall project delivery.

This award honours project teams that have successfully delivered high-quality projects while upholding strong standards of safety, sustainability, and technical performance.

Through this category, CIDB aims to recognise projects that set benchmarks for the Malaysian construction industry through effective collaboration, innovative solutions, and positive impact on the built environment and surrounding communities.

This category is divided into building (B) and infrastructure (I) comprising small, medium and major projects as follows:

Small: Contract value less than RM50 million

Medium: Contract value more than RM50 million up to RM200 million

Major: Contract value more than RM200 million



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following areas:

1. **Project Planning and Management**
Effectiveness of project planning, coordination, and management throughout the project lifecycle.
2. **Technical Excellence and Construction Quality**
Quality of construction, engineering solutions, and overall technical performance.
3. **Innovation and Best Practices**
Adoption of innovative construction methods, digital technologies, or sustainable construction practices.
4. **Safety and Environmental Management**
Commitment to safety performance and responsible environmental management.
5. **Project Impact and Value**
Contribution of the project to the client, users, community, and the built environment.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to construction projects completed in Malaysia.
2. Projects must have obtained **Certificate of Practical Completion (CPC), Certificate of Completion and Compliance (CCC), or equivalent certification** between **01 January 2021 and 31 December 2025**.
3. Projects which have **previously won in past MCIEAs are not eligible** for submission in MCIEA 2026.
4. Each contractor, client or project team may submit **as many projects within the eligibility period**.

OUTSTANDING YOUNG CONTRACTOR AWARD

The Outstanding Young Contractor Award recognises young contractors who have outstanding achievements, innovation, and a high level of professionalism in the construction industry, in line with efforts to advance the construction sector in a sustainable and progressive manner.

This award celebrates emerging leaders who show strong entrepreneurial spirit, professional excellence, and the ability to drive positive change in areas such as professionalism, project delivery, innovation, sustainability, and workforce development.

Through this category, CIDB aims to recognise and encourage the next generation of construction industry leaders who will shape the future of Malaysia's built environment.



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following:

1. **Professional Achievement**
Demonstrated achievements in managing construction projects, business growth, or organisational development.
2. **Leadership and Initiative**
Ability to lead teams, manage responsibilities effectively, and demonstrate initiative within the organisation or industry.
3. **Innovation and Industry Contribution**
Adoption of innovative practices, technologies, or initiatives that contribute to improving construction industry practices.
4. **Future Potential and Industry Impact**
Demonstrated potential to become a future leader who will contribute to the advancement of the Malaysian construction industry.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to **Malaysian citizens aged 40 years and below** on the date the nomination period opens.
2. The individual **must have at least 5 years of experience** in the construction industry.
3. The nominees must hold a **leadership position in a company registered with CIDB**.

CHANGEMAKER AWARD

The Change Maker Award recognises individuals who have made significant contributions in driving positive change and innovation within Malaysia's construction industry.

This award honours individuals who demonstrate visionary leadership, champion new ideas, and inspire transformation in areas such as technology adoption, sustainability, productivity, safety, professionalism or any industry practices.

Through this category, CIDB aims to celebrate individuals whose initiatives and leadership have created meaningful impact and contributed to the advancement of the Malaysian construction industry.



Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be assessed by an independent jury based on the following areas:

1. Leadership and Vision

Demonstrated leadership in driving change, innovation, or improvement within the construction industry.

2. Innovation and Transformation

Introduction or promotion of new ideas, technologies, systems, or practices that improve the industry.

3. Industry Impact

Contribution to improving industry practices, productivity, sustainability, safety, or professionalism.

4. Influence and Inspiration

Ability to inspire others and influence positive change across organisations or the wider industry.



Participation Criteria

1. This category is open to **Malaysian citizens or permanent residents** who are actively contributing to the construction industry in Malaysia.

2. The individual **must have at least TEN (10) years of experience** in their field of expertise.

3. Nominees may come from **contractors, consultants, developers, academia, government agencies, industry organisations, or private practice**.

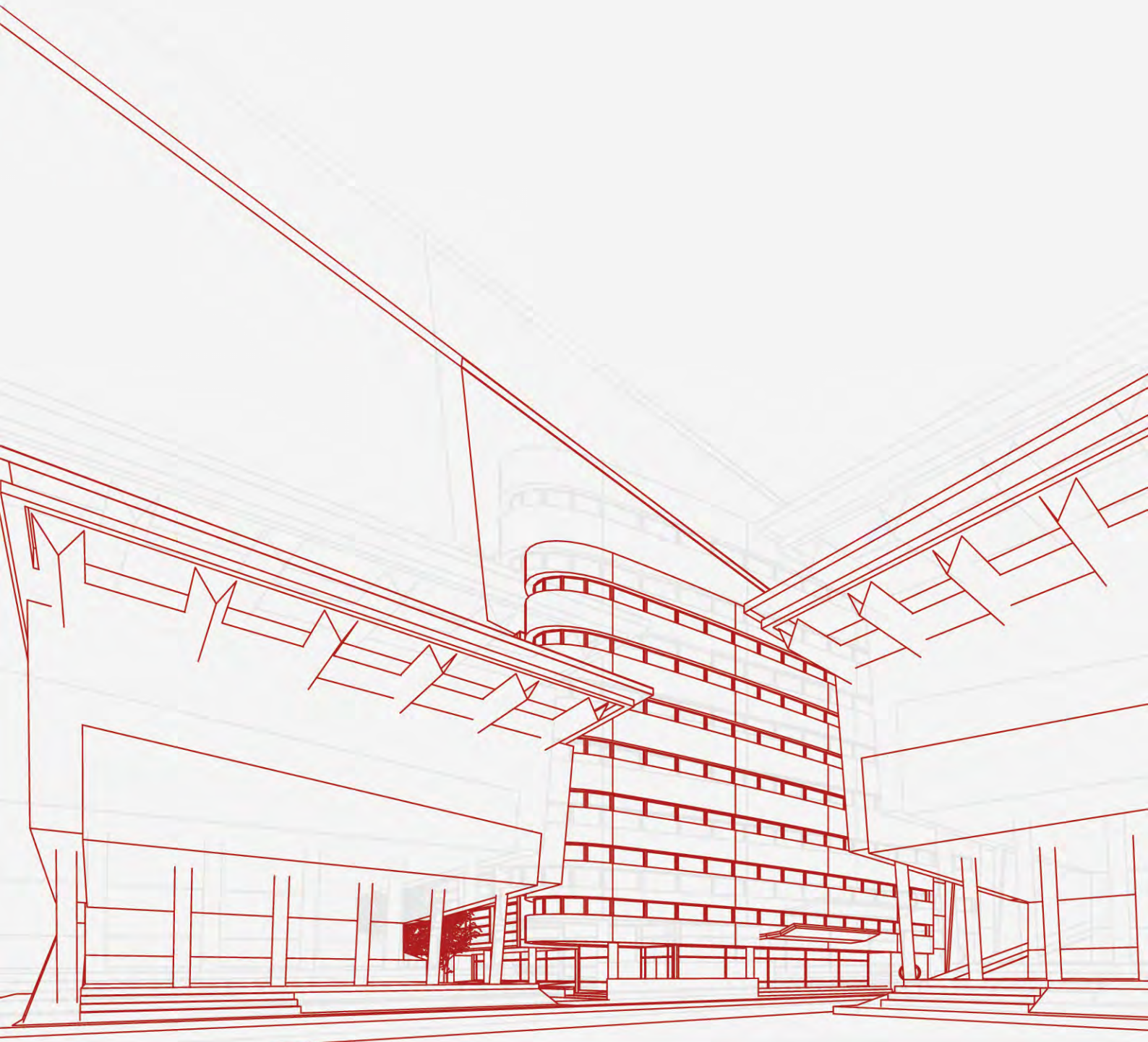
4. The nominee must have demonstrated **significant contributions in driving innovation, transformation, or positive change** in the construction industry.

5. Nominations may be submitted by **organisations, industry stakeholders, or the nominee themselves**.

PROMINENT PLAYER AWARD

This award aims to give recognition to an individual who best represents the qualities and attributes of a prominent construction industry player and has contributed significantly to the development of the Malaysian Construction Industry.

Selection of nominees for this category is based on recommendations from the CIDB MCIEA Secretariat.
